

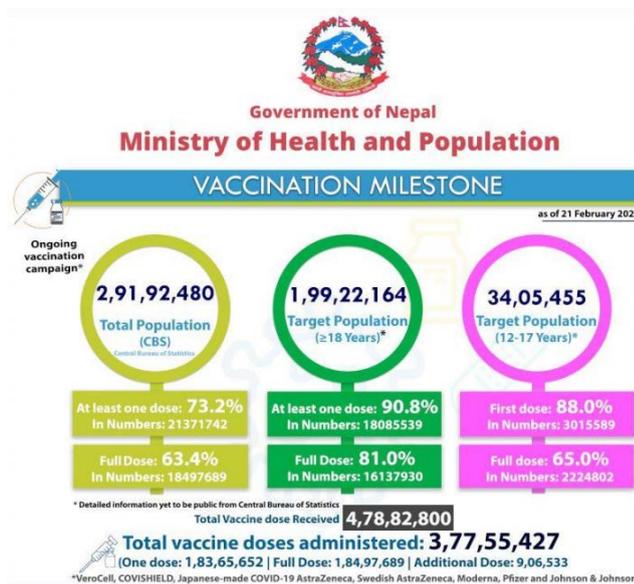

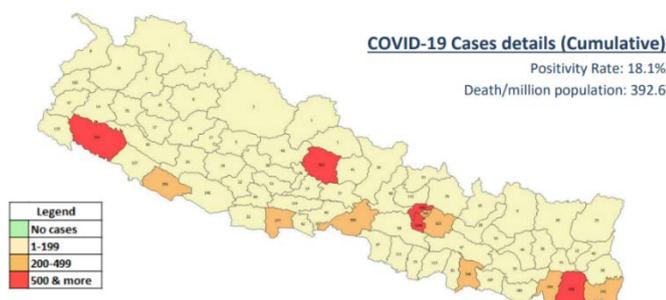

Stop handshakes and use non-contact greeting methods



Use video conferencing instead of face-to-face meetings
