

Pakistan Resilience Partnership (PRP)





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The national partnership's network comprises 142 disaster management authorities, 176 NGOs, 221 trade bodies, and 239 universities.

PRP in Numbers



Established multi-stakeholder country partnership to enhance coordination

Expanded the partnership to include National Health Emergency Preparedness & Response Network (NHEPRN) under Ministry of Health (MoH), Provincial and District Disaster management Authorities, and Pakistan Red Cresent Society (PRCS) as part of a national steering committee

Institutionalized the PRP by registering it under the company act (under process) to attain legal status for sustainability

Established a National Resilience Fund for resource mobilization and co-financing the disaster resilience agenda

Built awareness on Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) in organizational operations through PSEA Network

Expanded pool of emergency response actors for coordination with the inclusion of government, CSO, the private sector, media, academia, and UN agencies Revised National Disaster Response Plan (NDRP) based on the past experiences and global/regional obligations

Improved local level policy planning with specific coordination mechanisms and capacities for effective emergency response for greater applicability in the regions by developing provincial and district response plans

Enhanced private sector awareness and directed Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in line with Annual Development Plan and the Public Sector Development Programme for disaster management and emergency response

Fortified and updated the Nation Disaster Response Plan

Strengthened local coordination mechanisms through development of state, provincial and district level disaster and emergency response plans

Augmented coordination for response through mapping and capacity building of volunteers and development of strategic plan for National Volunteer Forum
