- Enhance active participation of local actors for disaster preparedness and emergency response and strengthen the coordination mechanism.
- Review, develop and integrate working modalities: Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), Rapid Impact Needs Assessment (RINA) tools, local response plans
- Develop model comprehensive disaster preparedness plans at divisional level
- Assess Private Sector engagement for business resilience
- Raise awareness and train Local Non Government Organisations and Civil Society Organisations to act as first responders during emergencies
- Establish a national level network for disaster preparedness
- Sharing knowledge, lessons and experiences



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
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The Sri Lanka Preparedness Partnership (SLPP) has been formed under the purview of **Asian Preparedness Partnership (APP)**. Established as a multi-stakeholder regional partnership under the **'Strengthening Capacity of Government, Local Humanitarian Organisations and the Private Sector on Preparedness for Response in Asia'** program, APP strives to improve inter-organisational coordination and dialogue between Government, Local Humanitarian Organisations and Private Sector to enhance capacities through partnerships, knowledge resources, training and networking opportunities.

Objectives of SLPP

- To improve humanitarian leadership and coordination through systematic and local institutional strengthening
- To attain better coordination of humanitarian actions by enhancing humanitarian information management and knowledge exchange
- To establish more effective partnerships among national and local humanitarian actors
- To strengthen local level disaster preparedness for effective emergency response.

Areas of Focus

- Strengthening capacity for disaster preparedness and emergency response at national level and local level
- Strengthening multi-stakeholder emergency response coordination mechanisms from national level to local level comprising Government, Local Non-Government Organisations and Private Sector
- Enhancing knowledge management, information exchange and learning mechanisms

Operational Modality

At National Level

- Identify, review and update national priorities through multi-stakeholder partnerships collaborations

At Local Level

- Adopt and contextualize national guidelines and tools as per local needs while enhancing coordination among partners
